





Happy Canada Day. Stay cool. Be happy.



Hola!

I hope this e-mail finds you well. It's already been four months since my first vows and my last e-mail as a novice. As you can see, I've changed the subject line accordingly... and for those wondering, yes, please continue calling me Maryse.

I've just landed in Montreal after three months of mission in the Basile-Moreau community, in another district of Lima, Peru. During this period, I agreed to leave my comfort zone and undertake new pastoral work, notably in a polyclinic in an underprivileged area and a home for people living with disabilities. In the first case, I welcomed patients and learned to take the pressure, offering a listening ear when needed. In the second case, I collaborated with a Salvadoran novice from another congregation to offer a time of socialization and recreation. I also continued to

offer homework help and an English course on Zoom to less affluent children, as well as resuming classes myself in my theology program. I'm very grateful to the community who welcomed me as a new teacher and showed me a lot of patience and kindness as I made the transition from novice to young teacher. Transitions are always a little difficult for me...

I'm delighted to be currently in Montreal to provide translation and interpretation services during my congregation's chapter. A chapter is a large assembly bringing together sisters from every corner of the congregation to establish the orientations for the next 6 years and elect the general council responsible for their implementation. For several months now, we have been taking part in various consultations on the themes addressed, while remaining attentive to the Holy Spirit and his

surprises. In fact, the chapter begins with a retreat. This time in Montreal also gives me the opportunity to meet several of my sisters whom I knew only virtually.

After Montreal, it's on to Winnipeg! I'll be arriving in the Prairies at the very end of July and leaving for Peru at the end of August.

I'll be taking advantage of my time in Manitoba to organize a thanksgiving mass on the occasion of my first profession. All of you who will be in Manitoba are cordially invited to this thanksgiving mass on **Wednesday, August 23, 2023 at 7 p.m. at Notre-Dame-de-Lorette parish (1282 Dawson Road, Lorette, MB)**, and to luncheon that will follow in the parish hall next door. I hope to see many of you there, so mark your calendars!

You remain in my thoughts and prayers!
